Tour Lake Street Curiosities

Join Dick Lanyon, former director of the Metropolitan Water Reclamation District, and **Gary Langwell**, facilities director of the Evanston Masonic Temple for two one-hour tours of these obscure buildings on Lake Street: The MWRD's Evanston Pumping Station, designed by F.L. Barrett in 1920, and the Evanston Masonic Temple, designed by Temple member John Holabird in 1928.

To our knowledge the Pumping Station has never hosted a public tour. Several years ago *Forgotten Chicago* featured the Masonic Temple in a public tour.

The tour starts at the Pumping Station 1455 Elmwood. At 11am we'll walk to the Masonic Temple, one block away. After the tour, meet at Bangers & Lace, 810 Grove Street, for refreshments and conversation.
