Owners choose the professionals that produce the project and Owners determine the budgets.



#### **Design Evanston Awards Criteria**

- 1. Nominee must be representative of a high quality of design in relation to the category within which it was nominated.
- 2. Nominee may be an example of a strong commitment on the part of the Owner, City Agency, Community Groups, etc. to produce a better than average high quality project.
- 3. The nominee represents a strong commitment on the part of the Owner or Developer to improve the quality of the neighborhood, especially a socioeconomically challenged one.
- 4. In the context of signage, the nominee represents a high quality design that is sensitive to the inherent quality of the structure it identifies and the requirements of the Evanston Signage Ordinance.
- 5. Small, humble projects must be given equal consideration with larger more "glamorous" projects.
