

Awards given to “Owners” Owners are the initial motivators and facilitators for good design projects.

Owners choose the professionals that produce the project and Owners determine the budgets.



Design Evanston Awards Criteria

1. **Nominee must be representative of a high quality of design in relation to the category within which it was nominated.**
2. **Nominee may be an example of a strong commitment on the part of the Owner, City Agency, Community Groups, etc. to produce a better than average high quality project.**
3. **The nominee represents a strong commitment on the part of the Owner or Developer to improve the quality of the neighborhood, especially a socio-economically challenged one.**
4. **In the context of signage, the nominee represents a high quality design that is sensitive to the inherent quality of the structure it identifies and the requirements of the Evanston Signage Ordinance.**
5. **Small, humble projects must be given equal consideration with larger more “glamorous” projects.**


Window Replacement First Presbyterian Church
